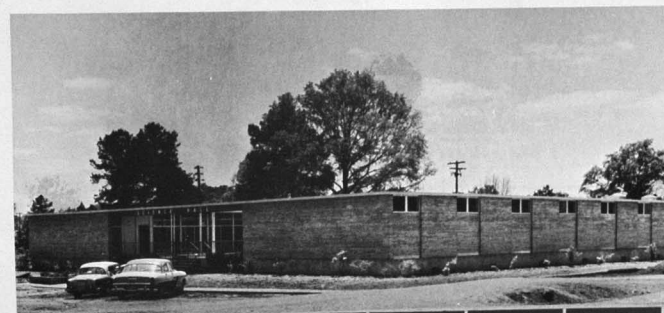


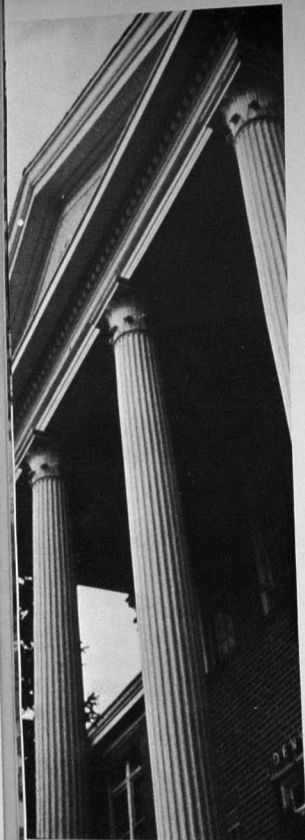
FOREWORD

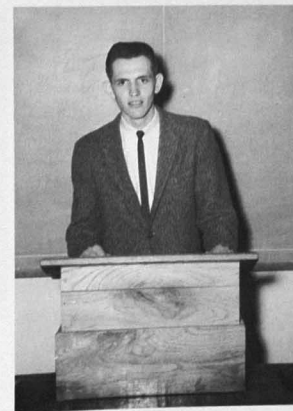
Perkolator Hall of Fame

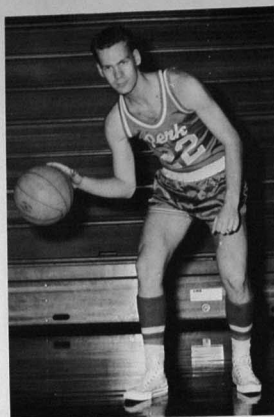

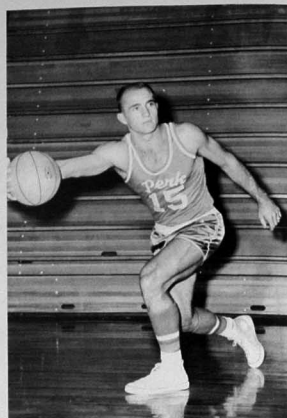

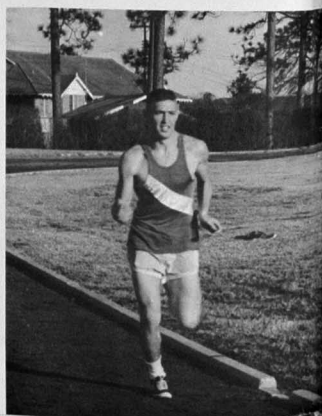
