To dedicate this yearbook is a customary gesture of recognition of some individual who has performed a noteworthy action or who has exemplified qualities worthy of such recognition.



The Student Body of Perkinston selected Mike Annis and Ronnie Mizell to represent the school as Mr. and Miss Perkinston College.




Directed by Mr. Eugene Clement, this choral group participates in the Mississippi Junior College Choir Festival. The Perk Choir also makes occasional television appearances.




