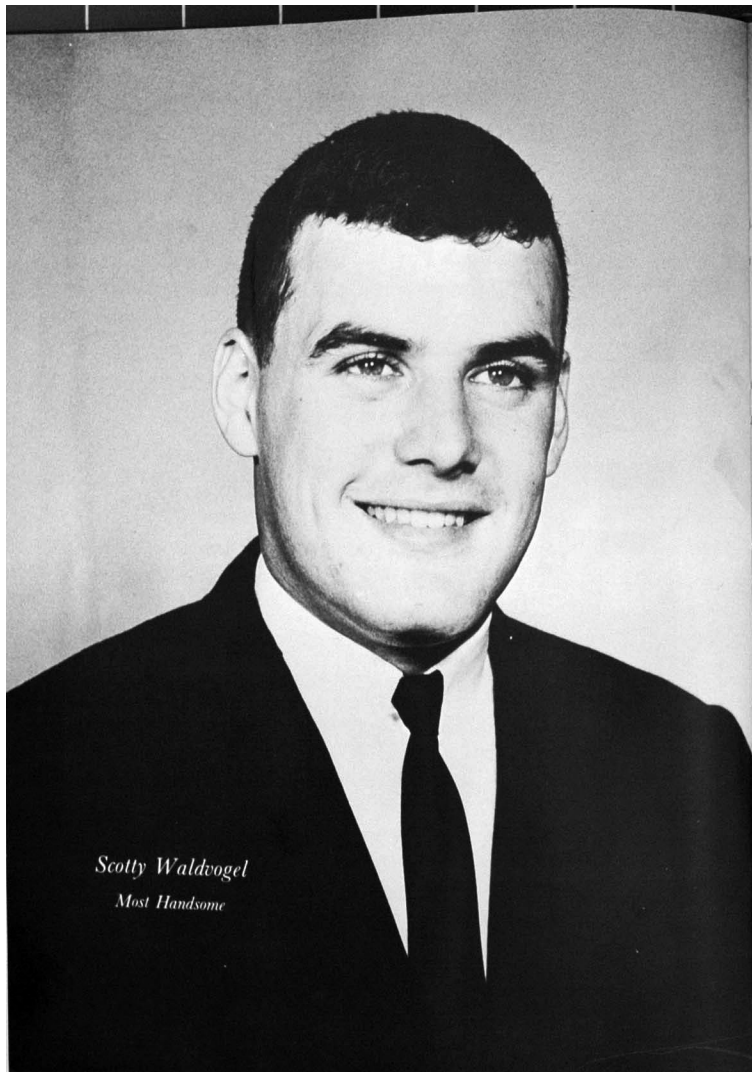
Mr. & Miss PJC Mike Annis Ronnie Mizell
