

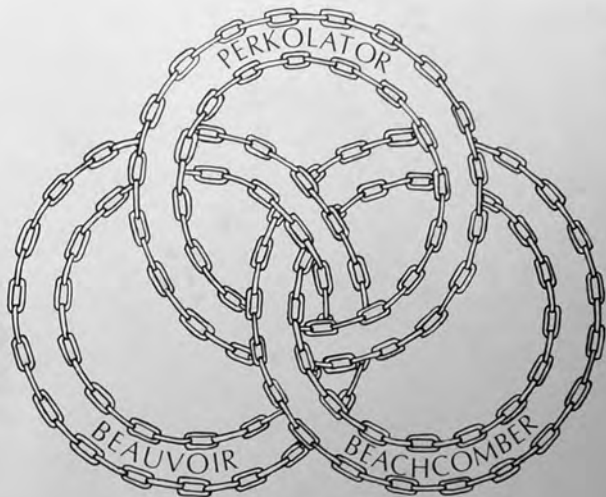

SCOPE:

The three campuses of the Mississippi Gulf Coast Junior College offer two-year Associate of Arts and Associate of Science degrees. There are also vocational and technical programs which can be completed in varying lengths of time from six months to two years. There are two-year programs that prepare students for specific employment; there are programs where those presently employed may up-grade and up-date their professions. A Manpower program is also in operation. A student may choose to work during the day and attend college in the evening, for the evening divisions are integral parts of each campus operation.

PURPOSE:

Mississippi's junior college system is one of the oldest in the nation, having been established in 1911. Junior colleges are becoming more popular each year as students and parents realize their value.

The Mississippi Gulf Coast Junior College has a campus near each population center in the area served. Students can choose the campus that best fills their need -- both academically and financially.

OPPORTUNITY:

The Associate Degrees offered by junior colleges are becoming more and more respected in business and industry as employers realize that many areas do not require four years of study to prepare an efficient and qualified employee. The two-year programs prepare a person for immediate employment but many of them also enable the person to transfer to a senior institution for further training.

Financial support for the Mississippi Gulf Coast Junior College comes from the people of the area through their tax dollars -- your tax dollars -- from the state, the counties of Harrison, Stone, Jackson and George, and the federal government.

Programs now offered at Jefferson Davis include Hotel-Motel-Restaurant Management, Nursing, Business Data Processing, Drafting and Design Technology, Police Science and Law Enforcement, Plumbing, Carpentry, Air-Conditioning and Refrigeration, Industrial Electricity and Electronics, Vocational Secretarial Training, Trowel Trades, Distribution and Marketing Technology, Radio Broadcasting Technology. The activities in a few of these fields are depicted on the next pages.



Radio Broadcasting

A goal of this curriculum is effective performance in the broadcasting industry through superior technical training and a well-rounded general educational program. It is designed to include the support and assistance of broadcasting stations located in the area served by the College. Students completing this program qualify for the third-class FCC licence.

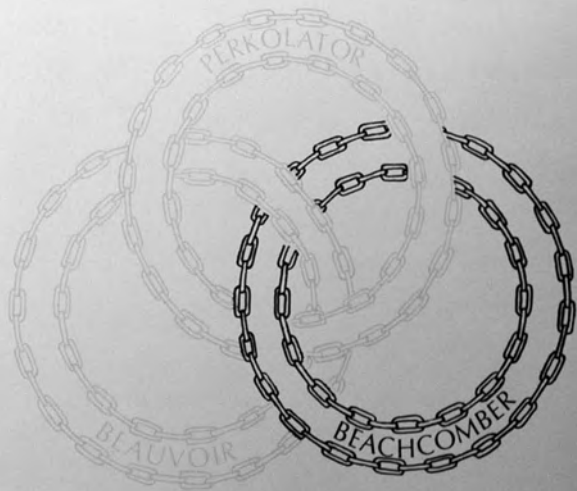

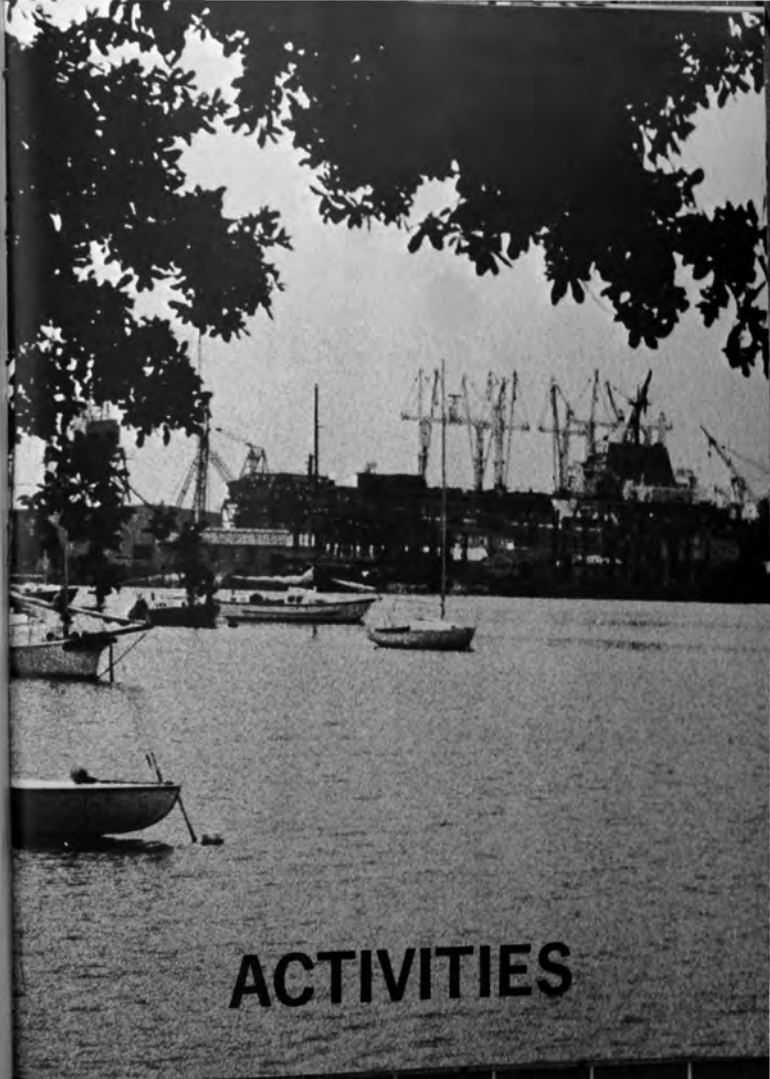

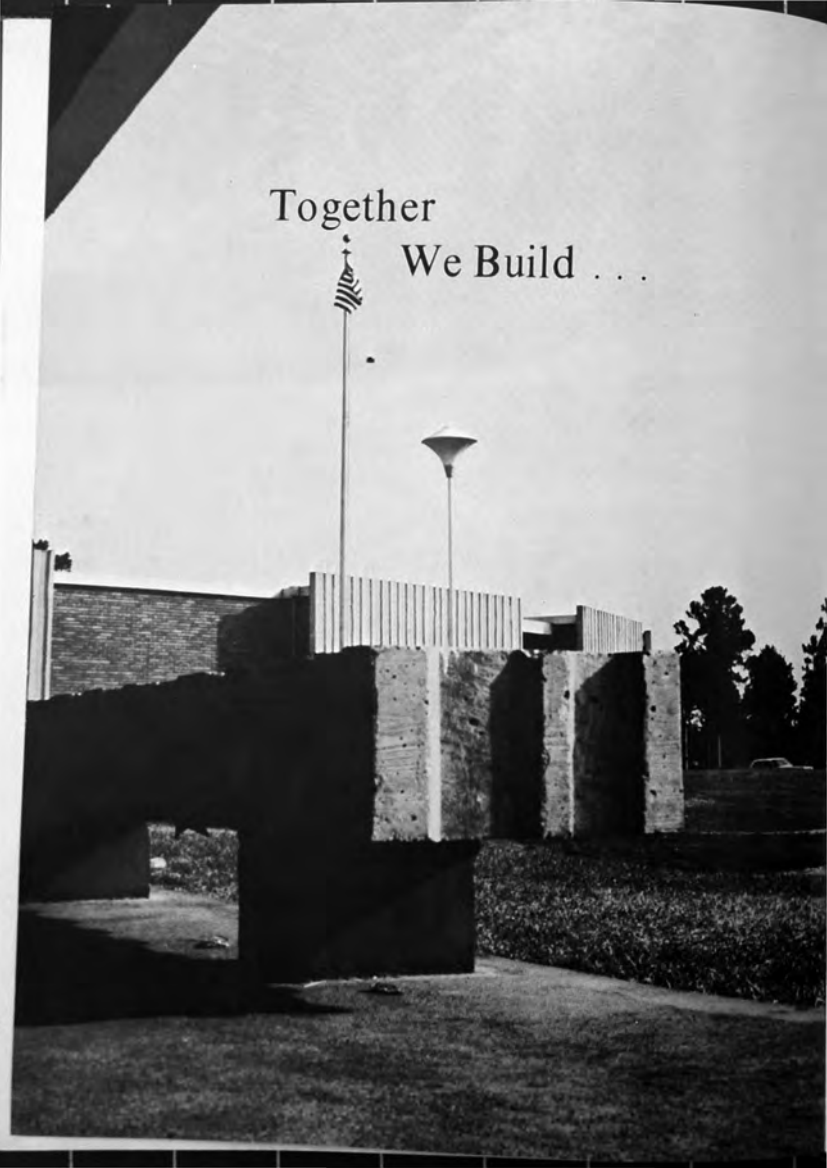
