





Mississppi Gulf Coast Junior College has once again demonstrated its remarkable versatility and its dedication to excellence in the national football championship it won last week.

Everyone connected with this unique educational institution has cause for pride. The Bulldogs may recruit football personnel from only four counties in Mississippi—Harrison, Jackson, Stone and George. But the Fort Scott team, defeated 22-13 by the Bulldogs, is the only junior college in Kansas. And it recruits grid prospects from the entire state and from such far away places as Iowa and Washington, D.C.

Winning against odds, however, is a habit with Coach George Sekul, who as a player led the University of Southern Mississippi to its only undefeated season back in 1958. His national champions, the first Mississippi has had since Ole Miss won the mythical senior college title in 1960, also had a perfect record for the 1971 season.

The laurels won in sports by Mississippi Gulf Coast Junior College are an appropriate addition to the academic achievements it has gathered over the years.

There is an entire generation of Gulf Coast business and political leaders who owe their education, absorbed in the dark days of the Depression, to the inexpensive, conveniently located system of junior colleges in the area.

It is fitting that the system has grown since then, adding campuses where needed. It is a propriate that it should present a curriculum that ranges from liberal arts to the vocational and technical skills required by the communities served. And in recent years, the system has developed enterprises, such as the recently held writers conference, that involve the school directly with members of the community.

We congratulate the Bulldogs on the national honors won on the football field. And we commend the entire system for the vital and vigorous role it plays in the Mississippi Gulf Cast community.








