

## FAQ – Keesler

### **How do the classes relate to CCAF?**

- CCAF requires a student to take 15 academic electives (College Algebra, English Comp I, Comp II or Public Speaking, Social Science course, and a Humanities course). When we create a degree plan for you, you will receive 60 hours of academic credit; fulfill the 15 academic electives needed for CCAF, and graduate with two degrees.

### **Will my military credits count towards my degree plan?**

- Your CCAF, thus far, will count towards your HPR credit and can be applied to your electives.

### **Will my degree say my pathway when I graduate?**

- Your degree plan will not say which pathway when you graduate, but when you transfer your transcript will note what your major was.

### **Is there a discount for military students?**

- MGCCC offers in-state tuition for military members that are stationed here.

### **How do I get access to the base?**

- If you do not have access, you provide your driver's license, state your license was issued, and date of birth to get onto the base.

### **Can anyone take a class on base?**

- YES

### **Can I take classes and not get a degree from MGCCC?**

- Yes

### **What's the difference in CCAF and an Associates through MGCCC?**

- CCAF is an Associate of Applied Science with only 15 academic electives. If you choose to come to MGCCC, you can graduate with 60+ academic elective hours and be on track for your Bachelor's degree.

### **I am active duty. Can I enroll in your Associate Degree of Nursing program?**

- MGCCC allows anyone to enroll in the ADN program, however this program is Monday-Friday during the day which may not be the best option for you if you work during the day. You would need to speak to your supervisor before trying to enter this program and looking into Bachelors of Nursing prep classes along with Nursing Commissioning program through the military.

### **Do you have free tutors?**

- We have a learning lab with free tutors.

### **Why is my degree plan not on the MGCCC website?**

- An enrollment specialist, advisor, or education representative creates a degree plan specific to what your major is. The military requires specific courses on your degree plan in order to get funding. If it isn't on your plan, you can't get funding for it.

### **What happens if I drop a class while using Tuition Assistance Funding?**

- Before dropping a class, always look at the refund/withdrawal schedule on the Academic Calendar. If you drop within the refund window, 90% of your TA is given back to the military and you pay the 10%. You will not be able to get funding for this class in the future with TA. If it past the refund window, you will have to pay back all of TA and it could affect your financial aid status if you receive FAFSA funds.

#### **What classes do I need to get MyCAA funding?**

- You have to take a career/technical course in order to apply for MyCAA Funding.

#### **How do I apply for MyCAA funding?**

- You create an account through the MyCAA website and upload your degree plan. Once you are enrolled in courses, you then submit a funding request for the classes you have on your schedule.

#### **How do I apply for TA funding?**

- You first must attend a briefing with the military education office. Once your degree plan is approved and you enroll in courses, you can submit a funding request.

#### **My TA is approved, who do I turn it into?**

- You can turn TA into any business office or the education representatives on the bases.

#### **What does TA not cover?**

- TA only covers tuition and nothing else.

#### **How do my grades get entered into the portal?**

- The education representative enters the grades into the portal.

#### **What happens if I start classes and then get deployed?**

- We have a military withdrawal. If you get deployed, you would fill out the military withdrawal form and submit a copy of your deployment letter. Once approved, you will not be penalized and funds will be dispersed back to the third party provider.
