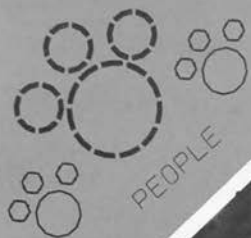
Hayden Hall Council

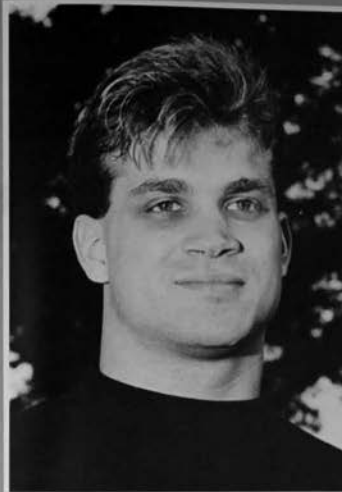

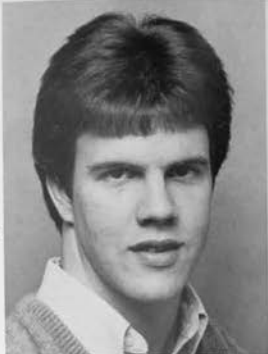

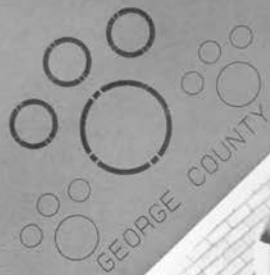

A year of celebration and change

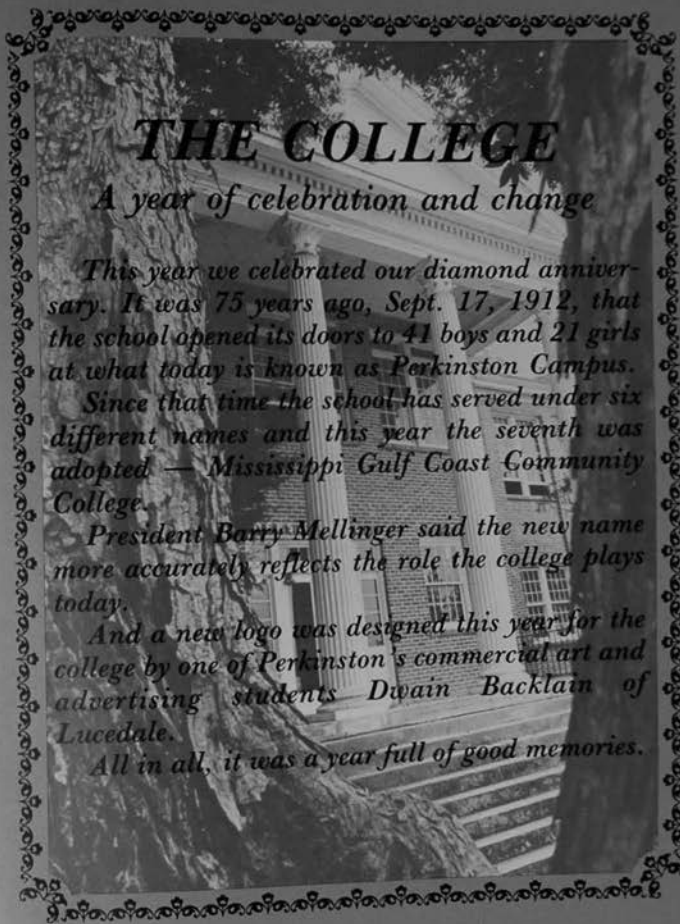

Homecoming Activities



Dr. Karen M. Yarbrough of Hattiesburg has become the 17th alumnus to be inducted into the Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College's Hall of Fame.

Yarbrough, a 1958 alumna of what is now MGCCC's Perkinston Campus, was honored at a homecoming luncheon on the Perkinston Campus. Featured speaker at the luncheon was Dr. Aubrey Lucas, president of the University of Southern Mississippi.

Yarbrough, vice president for research and extended services at USM, was presented a Joe Moran painting by MGCCC President Dr. Barry L. Mellinger. He praised her for her contributions to the field of education and science.

She began her teaching career in 1967 as an assistant professor of biology at USM and later founded the Institute of Genetics there. She has served as director of the institute since then.

Administratively, Dr. Yarbrough has served the university as research coordinator and assistant dean of the College of Science and Technology.

She has published a number of scientific articles and was recently elected as the president of the Mississippi Academy of Sciences—the first woman to serve in this capacity.

She has been the recipient of many honors including the USM Excellence in Teaching Award and the USM Faculty Research Award.

The Sam Owen Award was presented posthumously to James E. Reese during pregame ceremonies at Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College's homecoming, Saturday, Oct. 24.

Accepting the award was Reese's widow, Flo, of Brookhaven, Reese, a long-time radio executive and MGCCC official, died of heart failure on Feb. 14.

A former member of the MGCCC Board of Trustees, Reese joined the college in 1977 after a 30-year career which included serving as president of the Mississippi Broadcasters Association and part-ownership of 10 radio stations in the South.

During his long career, Reese was instrumental in helping establish the Mississippi Gulf Coast Junior College District that made it possible to build the Jefferson Davis and Jackson County Campuses on the coast and expand the original campus at Perkinston.

Football



Coach George Sekul, with 21 winning seasons behind him at Gulf Coast, had the roof fall in on him this year. It was the worst football season in his career.

The Bulldogs finished with a 2-8 slate with wins only against East Central, 7-0, and Copiah-Lincoln, 24-17.

During his tenure at Gulf Coast, he produced two national championship teams, one in 1971 and another in 1984.

In addition, he has won eight state junior college championships and 11 South Division titles. He has been named Mississippi Junior College Coach of the Year six times and was selected National Junior College Coach of the Year in 1971.

In 1986, the Bulldogs captured the state title and went on to defeat Lee McRae Community College 14-13 in the East Bowl at Banner Oak, N.C. to end with a 10-3 season.

With that successful season, the Bulldogs had National Championship embedded in their brains as the 1987 season began the first week in September.

Enthusiasm was high and the cry among the players at Gulf Coast's Press Day was that this was to be the year they could win the national championship.

Although Sekul had only four starters each returning to offense and defense, he felt his recruiting program and the addition of several players from senior colleges would enhance his team's chances.

"As far as 1987 is concerned, the season speaks for itself," Sekul said.

"The whole season went just like our final game against Holmes. We had a 10-7 lead with 12 minutes to go then got blown out. We played good football for three quarters and then the roof fell in.

"It seemed that the kids just quit when anything went wrong and we could not recover. We tried everything to motivate them."

So now the Bulldogs must lean on the famous standby quote: "wait 'til next year."

Men's Basketball



Coach Bobby Weather's basketball team finished the regular season second to Co-Lin. Their overall record at the time we went to press was 15-10, and 10-4 in the conference.

There was only one returning sophomore to the team. Troy Cobb of Moss Point, one of the leading scorers, averaging 13.5 points a game.

Other top scorers are Tony King of Alexandria, La. with a 13.8 average, and Eric Hamilton of Slidell, La. with 13.4.

King and Hamilton also ranks tops in rebounding. King's overall is 240 with a game average of ten. Hamilton has 216, averaging nine a game.

The 'Dogs last year ended the season with a 19-8 record overall and 10-4 in the conference. They placed first in the South Division Championship.
