



Celebrating Excellence: Zoie Boyd Awarded the 2023-2024 Sam P. Jones Memorial Scholarship




Zoie's pursuit of an area of interest in instrumental music, coupled with her unwavering dedication,

In honor of his remarkable contributions, the Sam P. Jones Band Hall was



erected in 1998, forever immortalizing his impact on the institution and its musical heritage. The Band of Gold continues to thrive, poised to deliver captivating performances throughout each upcoming football season.



Honoring a Gulf Coast Legacy

It is with deep reverence and heartfelt gratitude that we honor the life and legacy of Mr. William (Bill) Vierling, a pillar of the Gulf Coast community, who passed away on July 8, 2023, at the remarkable age of 100.

In reflecting on his enduring impact on education and his dedicated service to Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College, we pay tribute to a man whose contributions have left an enduring mark on our institution and countless lives during his lifetime.

A pivotal moment in Mr. Vierling's journey with MGCCC occurred in 1965 when he assumed the role of Director of Admissions and Guidance at the Jefferson Davis Campus, now known as the Harrison County Campus. During this time, enrollment at the college reached record highs, and the Harrison County Campus was still under construction. Undeterred by the challenges, Mr. Vierling, alongside three others, found himself on the front lines during registration, working tirelessly to ensure a smooth start for the upcoming academic year.

Amidst the organized chaos, the Harrison County Campus opened classes on September 7, 1965, hosting not only its own classes, but also 21 classes from The University of Southern Mississippi (USM). With this historic moment, the foundation of Mississippi's first multi-campus junior college was laid, setting the stage for a bright educational future.

In 2023, more than 1,700 students from 448 community colleges applied for the Jack Kent Cooke Undergraduate Transfer Scholarship. Out of the sixty scholarships awarded nationwide, Ridge and Anna have claimed the honor of being the only two recipients from Mississippi.
