

Honoring Earl Denson Gautier

In memory of Earl Denson Gautier, a titan in both professional and personal realms, Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College (MGCCC) pays tribute to his remarkable legacy. Earl's journey began at MGCCC, where he showcased exemplary leadership as Sophomore Class President and excelled academically as an Honorary Fraternity Officer for Phi Theta Kappa. It was during his time at MGCCC that he met Frances Elmira Miles, his lifelong partner.

While pursuing his education, Earl's industrious spirit led him to employment at Ingalls Shipbuilding, where he made significant contributions to ship design and construction. Graduating with honors from what was then Perkinston Junior College, now MGCCC, marked a significant milestone in his academic journey.

Earl's dedication extended to national service as a Staff Sergeant in the U.S. Army, 3rd Armored Division, earning recognition for his valor and leadership during his military tour in Europe. His exemplary efforts earned him a Certificate of Merit, recognizing his outstanding contributions at an early age. Earl's commitment to service continued in the U.S. Army Reserves until he received honorable discharge.

Retiring as Director of Engineering and Planning from Ingalls Shipbuilding after nearly 39 years on April 1st, 1994, Earl's dedication to education and community led him to serve on the MGCCC Board of Trustees for five years. To Earl and Frances, we extend our deepest gratitude for their tireless advocacy and steadfast commitment to the betterment of our community.

As we mourn the loss of Earl Denson Gautier's passing, we find comfort in the enduring inspiration he leaves behind for future MGCCC students. The MGCCC family honors Earl's memory and extends heartfelt condolences to his loved ones, knowing his legacy will continue to illuminate paths for generations to come.
