

# Honoring a Gulf Coast Legacy Mr. George Schloegel

1940-2023

Mr. George Schloegel's impact on Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College extends far beyond his impressive career. As a devoted supporter for many years, he and his wife, Peggy, shared a genuine love for the students at the college. Every conversation with Mr. Schloegel reflected his caring nature—he always started by asking about one's family and then inquired about the well-being of the college.



In addition to his passion for MGCCC, Mr. Schloegel had a deep appreciation for music. His instrumental role in fundraising efforts resulted in the acquisition of a Steinway piano for iMPAC in support of the partnership between MGCCC and the Gulf Coast Symphony Orchestra.

Beginning his journey at Perkinston Junior College as a freshman, Mr. Schloegel worked tirelessly to earn a college education, demonstrating his commitment to self-improvement. His career at Hancock Bank and subsequent role as President and CEO spanned 52 years, during which he made lasting contributions to MGCCC.



In 1982, he became an Executive Vice President of Hancock Bank and served as President of the Mississippi Gulf Coast Junior College Foundation Board. Over the years, he received prestigious accolades, including the Sam Owen trophy for distinguished service to the college and induction into the MGCJC Alumni Hall of Fame in 1984.



Retiring in 2008, Mr. Schloegel realized a childhood dream in 2009 by becoming the Mayor of Gulfport at the age of 68, endearing himself to the community during his one four-year term.

Even after his retirement, Mr. Schloegel continued to build his legacy at MGCCC. His dedication to education is evident in the scholarships that empower students to pursue their aspirations for a college degree. While he will be deeply missed, Mr. Schloegel's legacy lives on, embedded in the heart of Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College.
